In the Back Gallery

November 2 - 23, 2016

During the month of November, the back gallery will feature "Flowers", a member show of artwork with a floral theme. The show will feature all mediums including oil, watercolor, acrylic, pen and ink, jewelry and sculpture. This is always a popular theme so there should be plenty to look at.

The Firehouse Gallery is the most visible project of the Waimea Arts Council and is located at 67-1201 Mamalahoa Highway, in the heart of downtown Kamuela. It is housed in South Kohala's historic old fire station, at the crossroads of Mamalahoa Highway and Lindsey Rd. (Hwy. 19 and 190), across from the Waimea Chevron. Gallery is open Wednesday-Friday and Sunday, 11 am to 3 pm, and Saturdays 9 am to 3 pm. There is plenty of free parking behind the building.

"Volunteers of the Year"

At the reception for the Helen Cassidy Show, the 2015-16 "Volunteer of the Year" award was presented to Christian and Patricia Marinello.

The Marinellos are new members this past year and have jumped in to provide a lot of assistance - helping to improve the look of the gallery. Among their projects were: putting up the 3 smaller murals on the outside of the gallery, building a storage rack for the bunkhouse, cleaning out storage areas, opening up the back area of main gallery to create more display space, putting panels over the broken windows (including covering the inside one with cloth and painting the outside one), hanging the large artwork up high, and installing energy efficient bulbs in the gallery - reducing our electricity costs.



We are very grateful for their carpentry skills and their hard work.

Cherry Blossom Festival

The Waimea Arts Council and the Waimea Cherry Blossom Festival are requesting original art to represent the 2017 Annual Waimea Cherry Blossom Heritage Festival held in February 2017 in Kamuela, Hawai'i. Deadline for entries is **November 15, 2016**. All mediums accepted for consideration. There are no entry fees, however only two images will be accepted from each artist. All art must be available for sale.

Subjects could include, however not limited to cherry blossoms and trees, homestead and Waimea Church Row Park scenes, snow on Mauna Kea, festival activity scenes, or people, places and/or things that represent the festival and the viewing of the blossoms in the Spring.

If your art is chosen to represent the upcoming festival, you will need to furnish a current digital image of the art in high resolution, along with a digital photo of yourself and a brief bio. A festival poster will be reproduced using the image of the art with proceeds from the limited edition sales to wholly benefit the Waimea Arts Council and the Cherry Blossom Festival. This is an opportunity to get noticed via free publicity and sell your art.
